• The VA health care system has had electronic medical records in place since 1999. Since, 2004, there has been a national performance measure requiring that providers ask about tobacco use, provide counseling, and offer assistance at least once a year. This is implemented through a clinical reminder in the EHR.

- The UW-CTRI Education and Outreach program staff have worked with several Wisconsin clinics and systems to develop EMR/EHR templates for treating tobacco dependence.
- The core mission of the UW-CTRI Education and Outreach program is to engage clinicians, insurers and health systems to implement the recommendations in the PHS Clinical Practice Guideline. As part of these efforts, staff use academic detailing strategies to educate clinicians and practice teams about how to intervene with patients.

- We have developed a partnership with Epic Systems Corporation, a leading developer of electronic medical record systems, to engage in research that would involve enhancing the tobacco dependence treatment information contained in the electronic medical record.
